The Rector Writes

The late American Trappist monk Thomas Merton once said, "It is essential to experience all the times and moods of one good place." The Harvest season is an opportunity for us to once again come to know the uniqueness of our particular churches in the Clonenagh Group of Parishes. We come and gather to worship a Harvesttime primarily to give our thanks and praises to God, but to share our story as Christians in this time and place, and to encounter the presence of God.

At every celebration of Holy Communion we open the Prayer Book and we affirm that "The Lord is here. His Spirit is with us" – a central conviction of Christian faith. The Incarnation is the truth of God known in one place and time so that God can also be known in each place and time. God continues to dwell amongst us: to 'pitch a tent' with us, to 'tabernacle' amongst us (John 1:14, NIV). John makes a connection here with the Jewish Harvest Festival of Tabernacles (sukkot). The Jewish feast marks the gathering in of the harvest and also focuses on the Exodus of God's people from Egypt. The tabernacle (sukkah) refers to a small delicate structure that evokes both the temporary dwellings of farmers in the fields during harvest and the 'tents' in which the people of God lived on their long journey to the promised land.

During the festival of sukkot Jewish people build a temporary tabernacle and spend time in it as a stark meditation on these two elements, Harvest and Exodus, remembering that in vulnerability and fragility both of journey and of growth, we are called to deeper dependence on God. This Harvesttime we might share with our Jewish brothers and sisters in their meditation and give thanks for the place God now has called us to be.

Parish Reader

Do you see yourself as a Parish Reader? Parish Readers are people of all ages and from all walks of life who have a calling to assist in leading public worship and provides tremendous assistance to the Rector in his ministry by serving their parishes in this way. The role usually involves the reading of the liturgy (Morning and Evening Prayer, a Service of the Word, or other noneucharistic service), bible readings, prayers and assisting at Holy Communion. Parish Readers may assist in any or all of the ways which I have outlined here and on a regular or occasional basis depending on how they are needed by the Rector. While the role is normally restricted to involvement in public worship its significance cannot be under-estimated in its support for clergy leading the service. Parish Readers would usually undergo a short training course of several weeks duration, before being approved to exercise this ministry. The prospective candidate must also have the support of their Rector before applying. The approval granted for a Reader will normally last for 3 years and cease on the appointment of a new Rector. If you feel you have a calling to the ministry of Parish Reader, or would simply like to explore things further, please contact the Rector.
