## The Rector Writes

#### An Easter Reflection

John's account of Jesus' resurrection appearance begins with Mary standing outside the tomb crying (John 20:11). The significant moment of Jesus' resurrection commences with grief, as the tears from Good Friday and Holy Saturday were still present on the faces of Jesus' friends when he returned to them. They had scarcely had time to process the events of the previous days, in which their saviour and friend was killed, taking with him their hopes for the future.

Mary Magdalene is introduced in Luke's Gospel as having been freed by Jesus from seven demons, although the exact nature of these demons remains unspecified. She experienced considerable suffering before her healing. Mary chose to be present alongside Jesus during his final days, even standing at the foot of his cross. Following the Sabbath, she hurried to visit his tomb, likely intending to clean and embalm Jesus' body in preparation for burial. In her mourning, she aimed to serve the man who altered her life and provided her with healing and freedom.

Upon discovering an empty tomb, Mary likely presumed that Jesus' body had been stolen, depriving her of the opportunity to care for his body and grieve properly. This mirrors experiences familiar to many who were unable to bid farewell to loved ones in their desired manner during the Covid-19 pandemic, leading to compounded mourning.

John's Gospel (20:11-18) repeatedly notes the tears shed by Mary. John perhaps highlights the unexpected nature of Jesus presenting himself amid sadness and loss. In the early morning light, blinded by tears and uncertain about the whereabouts of Jesus' body, Mary mistook him for the gardener. Her failure to immediately recognize Jesus alludes to a profound truth: like a gardener, he ushers in new life from darkness. It was not until Jesus addressed Mary by name that she recognized him, as noted in John 20:16, NIV: "Jesus said to her, 'Mary.' She turned toward him and cried out in Aramaic, 'Rabboni!' (which means 'Teacher').
